Still, the little speedster got Alton's only touchdown — his 18th of the season - and gained 62 yards in 13 carries for a 4.8 average. Halfback Rich Caravia, like Bunch, a junior, was the workhorse for the Marcons. He carried 24 times and gained 113 yards for 4.7 per try.

Alton had a chance in the first quarter. Morris swiped his first pass on the Belleville 41. The Redbirds began to roll. Fullback Don Sackman got 14, then Wilson 13. A 13 - yard pass from Jeffries to Bosaw on fourth down moved to the Maroons' 24. The going got sticky. A clipbing penalty put Alton back to the Belleville 29 on Jeffries' good run to the 10. Wilson lost two but then a fourth down, 11 - yard pass to Randy Bailey was six yards short of first down.

Alton began another march that spanned the first and second quarters. It started from the Redbird 13. Wilson ripped off 17 and the Redbirds reached the Belleville 42 where a yard was needed on third down for a first down

Jeffries tried a pass to Bailey that just did miss connections against the bunched - up and surprised Maroons

"I called that play," said Yonkus. "I thought it would work with them looking for a running play. It almost did."

On fourth down, Jeffries faked a pitchout and kept. But, he didn't make the yard.

That gave the Maroons life. They pecked away at the Alton line with Caravia carrying nine of the next 11 plays to the Alton eight. There, Bunch fooled the Redbirds on first down with pass to right end Ed Merten for the touchdown.




